

HOWARD FOGG TO DO SERIES OF UNION PACIFIC PAINTINGS

CLUB MEMBER HOWARD FOGG, NOTED RAILROAD ARTIST OF BOULDER, COLORADO. HAS RECENTLY BEEN COMMISSIONED TO MAKE A SERIES OF SIXTEEN HISTORICAL RAILROAD PAINTINGS FOR THE UNION PACIFIC

RAILROAD. CAREFULLY RESEARCHED AND PAINSTAKINGLY DONE IN OILS, THESE PAINTINGS WILL BE USED ON THE 1969 UNION PACIFIC CALENDAR, CELEBRATING THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE DRIVING OF THE GOLDEN SPIKE AT PROMONTORY, UTAH. A CAREFUL EFFORT IS BEING MADE TO COMBINE, IN THE VARIOUS PAINTINGS, EITHER STEAM OR DIESEL POWER WITH SCENERY ON ALL DIVISIONS OF THE UNION PACIFIC, AT VARIOUS TIMES OF THE YEAR. WE ARE SURE THIS WILL BE ONE OF THE MOST NOTABLE CALENDARS THE UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD HAS EVER PUBLISHED.

REBIRTH OF THE

REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE HISTORICAL SOCIETY OF COLORADO MET WITH THE DENVER FEDERAL EXECUTIVE BOARD ON FEBRUARY 7, 1967, AND DISCUSSED THE ES-GEORGETOWN LOOP? TABLISHMENT OF A STATE HISTORICAL PARK IN THE VALLEY BETWEEN GEORGETOWN AND SILVER PLUME, TO BE KNOWN AS THE GEORGETOWN LOOP MINING AREA RESTORATION PROJECT. IT IS PLANNED TO BUILD A STATE PARK FROM THE CITY LIMITS OF GEORGETOWN TO THE CITY LIMITS OF SILVER PLUME, AND FROM INTERSTATE 70 ACROSS CLEAR CREEK TO SUNRISE MOUNTAIN. IT IS THE PLAN TO OPEN THE MOST SUITABLE OF THE OLD MINES. THE TRACKS INTO SOME MINES ARE STILL IN PLACE AND PEOPLE WILL BE ABLE TO RIDE A MINE CAR INTO THE MINE. THE NARROW GAUGE RAILROAD AND LOOP WILL BE RESTORED AND WILL PROVIDE ABOUT A 4-1/2 MILE RIDE FOR TOURISTS. THE HISTORICAL SOCIETY HOPES TO GET MATCHING FUNDS FROM THE BUREAU OF OUTDOOR RECREATION, THE HISTORIC PRESERVATION ACT AND THE HIGHWAY BEAUTIFICATION ACT TO BUILD THE PICNIC AREAS, TRAILS AND HIGHWAY REST AREAS. It is anticipated the cost will amount to one million dollars. As reported in a previous Newsletter, the Union Pacific Railroad has presented a \$10,000 check to the State Historical SOCIETY OF COLORADO TO FURTHER THE ORGANIZATION'S PLANS TO REBUILD THE FAMOUS OLD GEORGETOWN LOOP.

AND SAN JUAN RAILWAY

THE PROPOSED RIO GRANDE Your Club has refrained from making any statement regarding the PRO-POSAL OF THE RIO GRANDE & SAN JUAN RAILWAY COMPANY, INC. TO OPERATE PASSENGER TRAINS OVER THE D&RGW RR FROM ALAMOSA TO CHAMA AND RETURN

DURING THE COMING SUMMER MONTHS, AS WE HAD NO DEFINITE KNOWLEDGE OF THE SITUATION. OUR TRIP CHAIRMAN WAS ASSURED BY THE HIGHEST OFFICIAL OF THE D&RGW RR THAT THE PUBLICITY RELEASES REGARDING A "QUESTIONABLE AND TOTALLY UNRESOLVED VENTURE," BY T. T. HINMAN, PRESIDENT OF THE RG&SJ RR, "WERE UNWARRANTED AND THAT THIS PUBLICITY HAD COMPLICATED THE PICTURE, BEYOND A DOUBT."

MANY OF OUR MEMBERS HAVE ASKED HOW M. H. KLEBOLT OF THE ILLINI RAILROAD CLUB COULD ADVERTISE IN HIS CHICAGO-SILVERTON TRIP ANNOUNCEMENT THAT THE RG&SJ RY WOULD HAUL THEIR SPECIAL TRAIN FROM ALAMOSA TO CHAMA. IN ANSWER TO THIS, IT HAS BEEN LEARNED THAT BOTH THE D&RGW AND T. T. HINMAN HAVE TAKEN MR. KLEBOLT TO TASK FOR HIS UNAUTHORIZED ANNOUNCEMENT AND HAVE DEMANDED THAT HE STOP USING THESE ANNOUNCEMENTS. MR. HINMAN HAS STATED BOTH PUBLICLY AND IN LETTERS THAT HIS OPERATION OVER THE D&RGW DEPENDS ON "THE 1.C.C., THE MEXICAN GOVERNMENT, GOD, THE D&RGW AND SNOW ON CUMBRES."

IT APPEARS NOW THAT, UNFORTUNATELY, DISSENSION HAS BROKEN OUT AMONG THOSE ATTEMPTING TO SAVE THE NARROW GAUGE. Some, ALIGNED WITH HINMAN, WANT THE LINE ABANDONED SO THAT HE CAN OPERATE IT; WHILE OTHERS HAVE FORMED A GROUP THAT REPRESENTS ALL AREAS THAT WOULD BE AFFECTED BY THE ABANDON-MENT, AND THIS GROUP WILL FIGHT THE LINE'S ABANDONMENT.

MR. HINMAN HAS REPEATEDLY STATED THAT NARROW GAUGE COACHES FROM MEXICO ARE BEING REFURBISHED IN MEXICO CITY, AND WILL SOON BE IN COLORADO. ONE WAS TO BE ON EXHIBIT IN ALAMOSA LAST MONTH, BUT HAS FAILED TO MAKE AN APPEARANCE SO FAR. IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT MR. HINMAN HAS MADE APPLICATION TO ISSUE SECURITIES, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$300,000, WITH THE 1.C.C. ON MARCH 6, 1967.

INCLUDED IN THE FOREGOING ARE EXCERPTS FROM NEWSPAPERS AND MR. HINMAN'S OWN STATEMENTS, IN HIS LETTERS AND TO REPORTERS. THE ABOVE IS OFFERED ONLY FOR YOUR INFORMATION. THE CLUB HAS NOT TAKEN ANY OFFICIAL POSITION CONCERNING THE MATTER.
